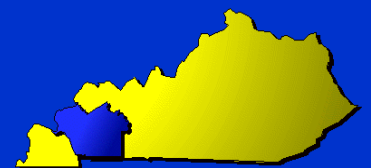

1	Pennyriple Parkway	HOPKINS	Reconstruct the northbound on-ramp at Mortons Gap from KY 813 to the Pennyriple Parkway. This project is identified as crucial to the I-69 initiative.
2	KY-91	CALDWELL	Reconstruction from West Kentucky Parkway to KY 139 in Princeton.
3	KY-1489	TRIGG	Widen from US 68 to Lake Barkley State Park entrance.
4	US-60	CRITTENDEN	Construct left turn lane at hospital in Marion.
5	KY-181	MUHLENBERG	Reconstruction from KY 1389 at Greenville to Wendell H. Ford National Guard Training Center north of the West Kentucky Parkway.
6	KY-181	TODD	Address safety issues concerning substandard vertical and horizontal alignments and narrow lanes from US-68/80 to KY 171.
7	I-24	CHRISTIAN	Construct new interchange at KY 107.
8	KY-1007	CHRISTIAN	North Dr. - Construct turn lanes at Glass Avenue in Hopkinsville.
9	KY-93	LYON	Construct left turn lane at Riverport entrance.
10	US-60	LIVINGSTON	Major widening to four lanes from approximately 0.5 miles east of Rudd-Spees Rd. to KY 937.

REGIONAL INITIATIVES

US 68/80 BRIDGES



• The US 68/80 bridges are listed as functionally obsolete due to narrow 9 foot traffic lanes. The proposed new lake bridges and the 4-laning of the remainder of US 68/80 is a crucial project needed to encourage economic development and tourism throughout all Western Kentucky. Design funds have been appropriated through the Transportation Cabinet.

ACTION: Support construction funds for the projects to be included in the next Highway Plan.

INTERSTATE 69



• The Transportation Cabinet has recently submitted recommendations to the Federal Highway Administration concerning the improvements that need to be completed before the two sections of the Pennyriple and WK Parkways can meet interstate standards. Although this report is still a working draft and has not been released outside the Cabinet, PADD feels the most critical project in need of funding in the 2010 Highway Plan is the Mortons Gap interchange reconstruction on the Pennyriple Parkway.

ACTION: Fund the KY-813 (Morton's Gap) Pennyriple Parkway interchange reconstruction estimated to cost \$8 million.



Workforce Training



- The West Kentucky Workforce Investment Board (WKWIB) provides training assistance to new and expanding industries for high-skilled occupations. The WKWIB provides intensive coordination with the incentive programs of the Economic Development Cabinet - Bluegrass State Skills, and the Kentucky Community and Technical College System (KCTCS).

ACTION: Support coordinated funding at all levels to provide training assistance for Kentucky industry/business to ensure their greatest support. The WKWIB has approximately \$7 million obligated to serve the needs of Kentucky industry/business at this time.

Area Agency on Aging & Independent Living

- The Pennyriple Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living is designated by the Commonwealth of Kentucky to develop and administer comprehensive programs and services which allow elderly and disabled individuals choices, flexibility and access to services which allow them to maintain a quality level of independence to remain in their own homes and communities. The Pennyriple Area Agency on Aging currently provides in home and community based services to more than **6,500** elderly and disabled individuals. There are approximately **400** individuals in need of services that are on waiting lists. These numbers continue to increase each month.
- Support both from the Federal and State level to ensure adequate funding is necessary as the Pennyriple Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living sustained a **five percent** budget reduction this fiscal year which negatively impacts service delivery and the clients served.
- The Area Agency on Aging and Independent Living currently has \$3.7 million allocated to serve the elderly and disabled throughout the nine county Pennyriple area.
